# Dear Resident.

Sensible spending and prudent planning has allowed your council to not just balance the books, but to support the projects that residents want.

The cost of our services has increased because of inflation and the community has needed them more than ever. But while the national media has reported on the reckless spending and risk-taking of some local authorities, your council's careful, considered approach has allowed Adur to thrive, not just survive.

That approach will continue, with tightly controlled spending allowing us to focus funds to continue supporting the community.

We'll improve facilities for residents, create a new sports pavilion for Buckingham Park in Shoreham, revitalise Lancing's Shadwells Road play area and help improve Southwick FC's ground for the community.

This year we've built 14 new council homes in Lancing, Shoreham, Sompting and Fishersgate but there will be well over 50 new council homes built in 2024/25 for local residents who have nowhere to live.

More than £10m will be spent improving our council homes, including replacing double-glazed windows, repairing roofs and walls and fitting new kitchens and bathrooms for tenants.

The new homes being created at Western Harbour Arm are needed, and we are working closely with the developers to minimise the impact on the community. We're also ensuring that our partners provide the extra school places, NHS facilities and community sites we need.

We will also continue to work hard on pioneering projects to restore the Adur Valley estuary and our coastline into havens for wildlife and biodiversity while protecting the greenbelt.

All that will come for a below-inflation 2.99% council tax increase - less than 19p per week extra for the average household.


