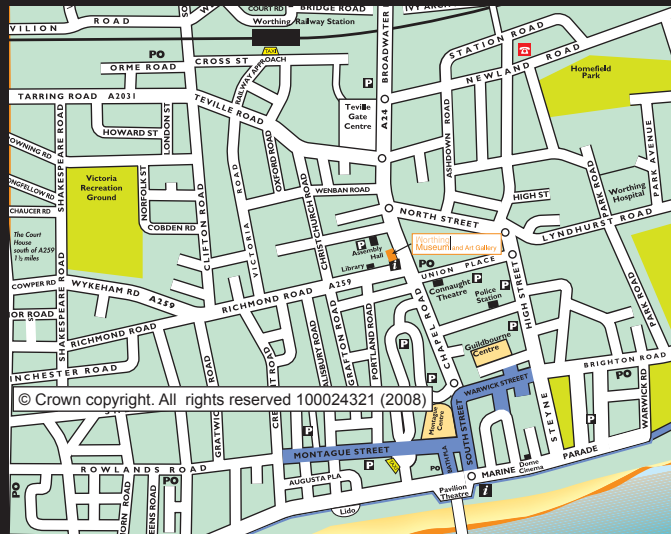

# Exhibitions July 2009 - 2010

## In the **Art Gallery**

### **Youth Art Collaborative**

**12 December – 27 February 2010**

Lancing College, The Sir Robert Woodard Academy (formerly Boundstone Community College) and Davison CE High School for Girls show us the best of their students' artistic talent in this all-new collaboration, representing GCSE, A level and project work. Specially invited to celebrate and showcase some of the area's most ground-breaking art work being produced by young people across both the state and private education sector, this exhibition explores the breadth of media and quality of teaching and resources available to our local art students today.

### **Skin Deep**

**13 March – 28 August**

The Sussex Road Group is exhibiting for the first time at Worthing Museum and Art Gallery. Using the human figure as their starting point, the Worthing based artists to explore the theme 'Skin Deep' with a wide approach that encompasses painting, drawing, photography and 3D work.

## In the **Studio**

### **The Human Face of Death Row**

**19 December – 20 March 2010**

Bringing the viewer face-to-face with different individual perspectives on the death penalty and reflecting on the human face of death row, painter Claire Phillips communicates her personal experience of meeting people who have faced this extraordinary situation. Her subjects include death row inmates and their families, exonerated inmates, an executioner and defence lawyer. The comfortable nature of the paintings is juxtaposed against a more challenging sound track of interviews and commentary from an execution.

This work is facilitated by the Arts Council and legal action charity, Reprieve.

### **The Near Far Pool**

**27 March – 26 June**

All societies have socially excluded people living within them, people whose talents are often hidden or ignored due to mental illness, learning disabilities and prejudice. In this special collaboration with Creative Futures, an organisation set up to facilitate and promote artistic development, we reveal the wealth of individual talent across East and West Sussex, in the form of some 30 contemporary paintings, all of which are for sale.

## **Adur Art Collective**

**10 July – 2 October**

In celebration of Worthing and Adur Council's partnership working, this all-new exhibition showcases Shoreham district artists fresh from the Adur Festival Art Trail. "Contemporary, affordable, diverse and unique" captures the essence of up to 80 mixed media works by some 30 professional painters and crafts people.

## In the **Garden & Garden Gallery**

### **The EYE Project**

**21 November 2009 - 6 March 2010**

EYE stands for Eco, Young and Engaged - a group of 14 schools across East Worthing and Adur brought together with environmental experts by Tim Loughton MP, for the first Eco Summit held in February 2008 at Worthing Town Hall to promote environmental best practice across local communities. A 26 point 'Green Print' plan has been drawn up and the students have been involved in such initiatives as 'Plastic Bag Free Day.' Startling sculptures and art work made from recycled materials by students at these schools not only celebrate the efforts of Worthing and Adur's young people to make the area 'greener', but also tackle wider environmental issues internationally.

### **Jon Edgar Sculpture**

**20 March – 19 June**

Working within the same tradition as artists like Eric Gill, Jacob Epstein and Henri Gaudier-Brzeska, Jon Edgar is a Frink School trained sculptor, now based in West Sussex. Warm direct carvings in wood and stone contrast with closely observed terracotta portraits of eminent sitters. Jon's influences come from medieval artists as well as the veteran sculptor and teacher Alan Thornhill, whose working methods dispense with the pre-conceived. This exhibition of over 35 tactile works extends beyond the garden to all around the museum and art gallery.

### **Double Take**

**3 July – 25 September**

"Brighton Sculptors" have exhibited in the candlelight of the splendid Brighton Church of the Annunciation for 9 years. They move from this much visited venue on the Hanover Trail during Brighton Festival to flourish in the open, distracting Worthing commuters. Members model, cast, carve and construct in metal, stone, resin and mosaics many alternative ideas in 3D for indoors and out.

## In the **Norwood Gallery**

### **Drawing Lace**

**24 October - 9 January 2010**

Teresa Whitfield's work brings archived museum lace to life in this stunning exhibition of intricate white ink drawings. The process of creating these life-size drawings is almost a re-enactment of the labour intensive lace making process and so true-to-life are the images that tiny threads appear to intersect each other, recording the minuscule defects in the fabric and the way the threads interweave. The exhibition includes drawings of some of Worthing Museum's own lace collection and viewers will be able to view the original samples along side the drawings.

### **Toovey's Choice**

**30 January – 17 July**

Who would turn down an invitation to browse the stores of our celebrated fine art collection and make a selection for our new display? To mark our appreciation of Toovey's continued support of the museum and its collections we asked Rupert and Nick Toovey if they would like to hand pick personal favourites, telling us why they chose them.
